Information for Erasmus+ Outgoings

Below, you can find important information regarding your ERASMUS+ student mobility to the United Kingdom from January 1, 2021.

Please note that this information is accurate as of January 26, 2021. Please make sure you stay up to date on the information.

Will I be able to spend my Erasmus+ mobility in the United Kingdom?

- Yes. Mobilities to the United Kingdom are currently possible for at least the academic year 2021/22. You can thus continue to study in the UK within the Erasmus+ framework.
- Please note, however, that all students entering the UK after December 31, 2020, who plan to spend more than six months in the United Kingdom must hold a visa and are required to obtain insurance through the National Health Service (NHS). More information can be found <u>here</u>.
- The regulations regarding your visa that are listed below only apply to Outgoings with German citizenship, or citizenship of an EU or EFTA member country. Should you be a citizen of a country not listed here, you can find more information about the visa regulations that apply to you here.
- Please note that EU citizens require an electronic passport to enter the UK from October 1, 2021. If you are not an EU citizen, please make sure you have the appropriate travel documentation.

I travelled to the UK after December 31, 2020, and do not plan to stay longer than 6 months. Which regulations apply to me?

- You are not required to obtain a visa for the duration of your stay.
- Please make sure you have sufficient health, accident, and liability insurance. Your <u>EHIC</u> (European Health Insurance Card) is currently still valid in the UK, but we encourage you to take out a travel health insurance.

I travelled to the UK after December 31, 2020, and plan to stay longer than 6 months. Which regulations apply to me?

- You are required to obtain a visa for the duration of your stay. Information regarding the visa application can be found <u>here</u>. The application fee of 348 £ can be reimbursed by our office. To receive reimbursement, please apply for your visa <u>before</u> your stay. Please contact Greta Matthis for more information (*greta.matthis*@*zv.uni-freiburg.de*).
- You are required to take out insurance from the National Health Service (NHS) and pay the Immigration Health Surcharge of 470 £. More information can be found <u>here</u>. You may be entitled to a <u>reimbursement</u> of the surcharge directly from the NHS after the end of the calendar year.
